Informational/Discussion items

Mountain View Fire settlement: County staff lead a discussion about possible local uses for \$1 million+ that were received in the MT View fire settlement with Liberty. Suggestions included building/planning a Recreation Center, purchasing fire equipment and funding insurance rebates and firewire activities. John suggested having short, medium and long term goals. The group discussed hiring a consultant but settled on establishing a working group and holding a town hall meeting. The desirability of promoting projects that would be eligible for matching funds grants was mentioned. Some thought earmarked funds would be

and further discuss this and the creation of working group at the next meeting which provides adequate time for the issue; Wendy will determine if that will be the next or following meeting. It was suggested that a special meeting could be held the hour before the regular RPAC meeting.

Golden State Connect presentation on local installation and construction: On-line representatives from GSC explained the project. Digital 395 provided the internet trunk line while GSC, a government agency utilizing contractors, will provide the 'last mile' service. They are putting in a network that will be used by various ISPs.
