 - a. Preparing for Triennial Review

- V. Housing Update (discussion): Amanda Greenberg
 - a. Planning on putting out an RFQ/RFP for a development partner for a 30-40 unit permanent supportive housing and affordable housing development in Mammoth
 - i. BHAB responded very positively and offered their express support in pursuing this project and expending MHSA funds for the project
 - ii. MCBH is currently looking for possible land for the project
 - iii. Lois recommends talking with MUSD regarding 2 acres behind ice rink and would recommend proposing child care on the site to build buy-in
 - iv. Property on Minaret across from Sam's Woods
 - v. Other thoughts:

- vi. We will probably encounter fewer NIMBY issues in more commercial zones
- vii. Combining mental health housing with general affordable housing will help with NIMBY issues too
- b. MCBH proposes selling the Davison House property (owned 87% by MCBH and 13% by Mono County)
 - i. County Counsel is currently reviewing the process for selling a property
 - ii. BHAB responded very positively and offered their express support in selling the property and putting these funds toward the new proposed housing development
 - iii. BHAB members also suggested that Mono County BOS ought to restrict its 13% share of the funds from the Davison sale for housing
 - Mono County funds from the sale could roll into the new project or possibly help fund TOML's Housing Coordinator position
- c. Walker Small House Project: MCBH proposes partnering with Stanislaus County Housing Authority to place four 560-square foot houses behind the Walker Wellness Center. The project would cost approximately \$540,000 + infrastructure costs

 - a. Amanda outlined the two programs funded in this category
- VII. Advisory Board Appointments (discussion, possible action):

 - ii. Stacy will work on putting together recommendations for the BOS to approve
 - iii. In January, BHAB will elect officers

 - a. IB: nothing to report other than what's in the news; Moriarty retiring, Phil West moving up; haven't officially announced but she is running again
 - b. LK: multi-agency vaping meeting tomorrow; there is a perception that it's prolific; Robin just presented on suicide prevention to HS lots of contact but no connection is an issue; new school resource officer: Daniel Hansen: he will be going to SRO school
 - c. SB: re-funded for supervised visitation program through 2021; funded through Mono County probation for BI and 52 week child abuse/parenting classes (typically courtordered but also voluntary); \$50k grant to help buy new interview equipment for Inyo and Mono County DAs and forensic interview training
 - d. CB: Angel giving tree is Saturday for Mammoth; coordinate with shop with a cop to avoid overlap; PIT Count many interested in volunteering
 - e. AD: Council approved Lieutenant position; Hannah is going to Nevada Hwy Patrol (will need a new executive assistant); new station is awesome; Cerro Coso has a reserve academy
 - f. JF: No updates
 - g. SC: BOS is trying to move the county line spurred on by Rainbow Falls incident; moving the line is done through administrative legislation; as long as it's non-controversial in Madera, it should happen; not complicated because no one lives there; CIBHS and CMHPC trainer could come from Shasta (Susan Morris) for an anti-stigma training (maybe spring/summer - open to LE, etc.); she is running for re-election
