# **BLUEPRINT FOR A SAFER ECONOMY – PURPLE TIER**

- Mono County data\* used to determine Tier Status:
  - 17.4 Case Rate/100,000
  - 6.6% Testing Positivity rate
- A county must have been in the current ٠ tier for a minimum of three weeks.
- A county must meet criteria for the ٠ next less restrictive tier for both measures for the prior two consecutive weeks in order to progress to the next tier.

# **SCHOOL GUIDANCE**



https://schools.covid19.ca.gov/

- Guidance states that if schools have not re-opened, Grades 7-12 can only open in the Red Tier
- Grades K-6 can open in the Purple Tier if the case rate is below 25 cases per 100,000/day for 5 consecutive days (currently 29.7)
- Mammoth Unified School District (MUSD) can only reopen for in-person Elementary School instruction when the Mono County case rate falls below 25/100,000, and for middle and high school when we attain Red Tier status.
- As per the Blueprint for a Safer Economy. Schools that have already re-opened, like ESUSD (1/19) can remain open even if the tier position worsens.

## **COVID-19 VACCINATION PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY REQUIRED**



- Vaccines are allocated by the state according to permanent resident population, <u>so vaccination</u> <u>appointments are only for people who work or live in Mono County, regardless of immigration</u> <u>status.</u>
- To ensure Mono County is administering vaccines according to <u>State guidelines</u>, proof of eligibility is now required at the vaccination clinic.
- Proof of Mono County residence or employment is required. This includes, but is not limited to:
  - Driver's license/Real ID
  - Employment paystub
  - Note from employer
  - o Employee ID
  - Any document that verifies you as a Mono County, full-time resident (<u>second homeowners are</u> not eligible to receive the vaccine in Mono County)

# WHERE ARE WE NOW?



Mono County is now vaccinating residents aged 55 years and older with certain underlying medical conditions, including pregnant women of any age. These individuals are at increased risk for severe illness from the virus that causes COVID-19. Some of the higher risk underlying medical conditions include:

- Cancer
- Chronic kidney disease
- COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease)
- Down Syndrome
- Heart conditions, such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies
- Immunocompromised state (weakened immune system) from solid organ transplant
- Obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 30 kg/m2 or higher but < 40 kg/m2)
- Severe Obesity (BMI  $\ge$  40 kg/m2)
- Pregnancy
- Sickle cell disease
- Smoking
- Type 2 diabetes mellitus

# **VACCINATION FAQ'S – THE TOP QUESTIONS**

I got Vaccinated, can I stop wearing a mask?



• We still need to understand a number of things better, including whether vaccinated people can still be silently infected and spread to other people and how long the protection from the vaccine lasts.

ushing Covid.

- The vaccines are not **100% effective** a few vaccinated people still got sick in the clinical trials.
- Concerns right now that the vaccine might not work as well against one or more of the new mutant strains of the virus that are appearing and spreading (no evidence of that yet, but now is NOT the time to relax any safety measures).
- Relatively few people have been vaccinated in California so far it makes sense to continue to expect everyone to wear a mask.
- Please keep in mind too that there is a good chance that you would make others uncomfortable by going without a mask.

# TESTING FOR COVID-19 DURING THE ROLLOUT OF VACCINES

• Wear facemasks: Even after getting both doses of the vaccine, it's possible, though not likely, to get COVID-19. If you get COVID-19 after being vaccinated you may not get sick, but you may still be able to spread it to your family and friends.

- Stay home if sick: If you feel sick, you should stay home and isolate from others.
  Get tested: If you have symptoms or have been exposed to with someone with COVID-19 you should get tested.
  This is true even after being vaccinated. Tests for COVID-19 work the same in vaccinated people as they do in unvaccinated people.
- Testing keeps you, your family, and friends safe.
- If your job requires it, you still need to get tested regularly. Even if you had the vaccine.
- Wash hands: Wash your hands often with soap and water. You can use a hand sanitizer with 60% alcohol to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
- **Physical Distance:** Keep at least 6 feet away from people who do not live in your household.
- Gather outside and increase airflow in indoor spaces: If the weather permits, outdoor events are much safer than indoor events.
