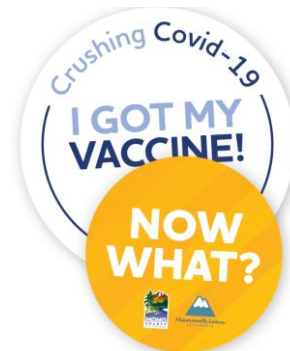




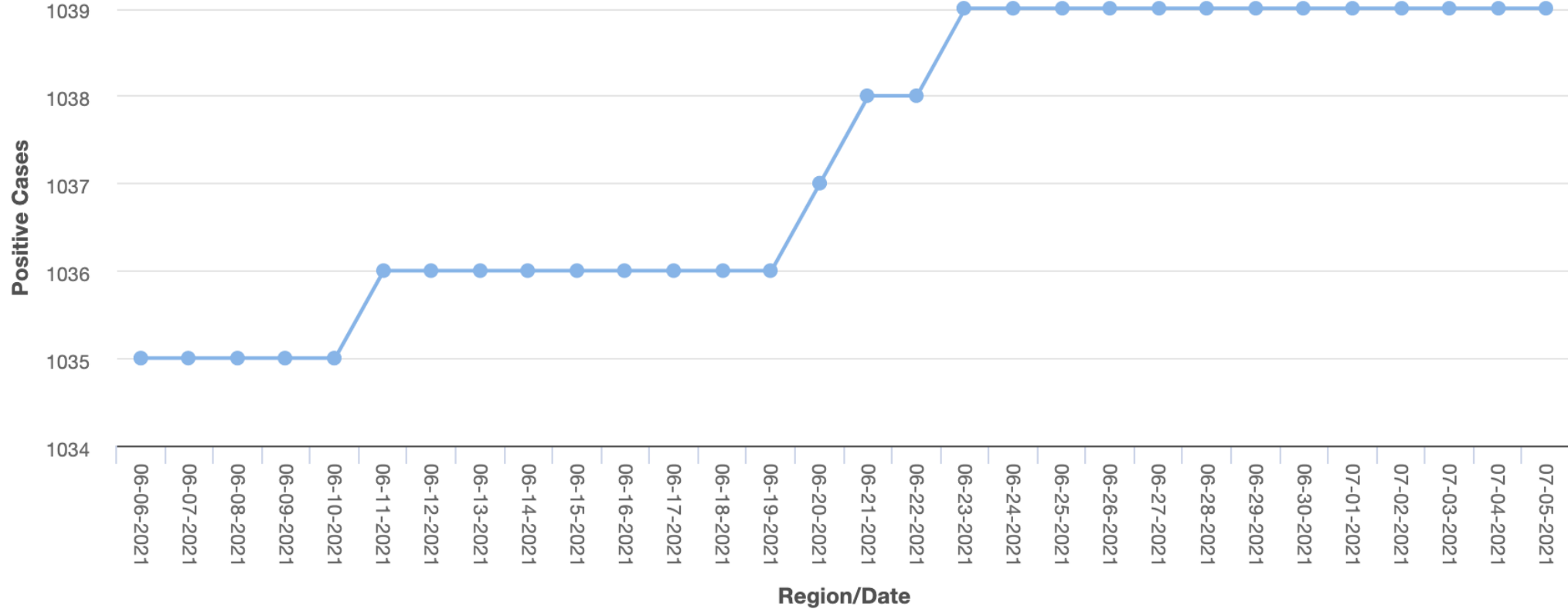

MONO COUNTY ANNOUNCES COVID-19 VACCINE TRANSITION PLAN

Residents Encouraged to Visit My Turn Website to Schedule Appointments

June 30, 2021 – Effective July 1, Mono County Public Health’s walk-in clinics will be winding down to twice per month as local partners, including Mammoth Hospital, join us in administering COVID-19 (Coronavirus) vaccines. Safe, free, and effective COVID-19 vaccines are now available to everyone age 12 and up, and Mono County Public Health urges unvaccinated residents and visitors to join the millions of Californians who’ve already been vaccinated in an effort to help end the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Mono County residents and visitors are encouraged to visit the California Department of Public Health’s My Turn website at myturn.ca.gov to check for local appointments.
- Mammoth Hospital, Vons, and Rite Aid have all joined in the vaccination effort.
- Appointments can be made directly with your medical provider, and at Mammoth Hospital.
