

- GETS ALERTS to know what to do.
- MAKE A PLAN to protect your people.
- PACK A GO BAG with things you need.
- BUILD A STAY BOX for when you can't leave.

GET ALERTS

- Sign up for emergency alerts via Ready Mono
- Update your profile



MAKE A PLAN

- Be ready to go in the safest direction, to the nearest safe place, with little warning.
- What is the plan if the power is out for an extended period of time

PACK A GO BAG


 Pack a Go Bag for when you have to leave home in a hurry. Pack things for each member of your household. Think about what you would take if you had 15 minutes of notice to leave your home. Now, think if you had just two minutes.

BUILD A STAY BOX

 Add items to a Stay Box, for when you can't leave home. Prepare for at least 7-10 days without water or electricity. Save up a little at a time, until you have enough for everyone in your household to get by. Remember any pets. If you already own a flashlight or a portable radio, keep it someplace easy to find.

HELP FRIENDS

• Help them sign up for the Access and Functional Needs Registry (AFN)
