STOP THE GOLDEN MUSSEL

If the golden mussel invades, we could lose it all:

- Fish populations at risk golden mussels disrupt aquatic ecosystems and outcompete fish for food.
- Waterways overwhelmed they can survive and reproduce rapidly in our waters, clogging pipes, docks, and shorelines.
- Local economy devastated fishing, tourism, and water infrastructure all face serious harm.



Stop the spread of invasive species.

CLEAN - DRAIN - DRY

- Inspect and clean watercraft and equipment and remove visible mud, plants, fish, or animals.
- Drain all water, including from lower outboard unit, ballast, live-well, buckets, and anything else that contains water.
- Dry everything for at least five days or with a towel before reuse.
- Dispose of debris and unwanted bait, worms and fish parts in the trash.
