**A. DIRECTOR REVIEW WITH NOTICE/Paiva** (~1:30 pm) Review and accept for processing an application to permit three power poles, extending power lines 600' overhead into 650 Eastside Lane, Walker (APN 002-430-018). The power line would then drop underground for the remaining distance to the residence, approximately 300'. The property is 16.9 acres and designated Rural Residential – 5 acres minimum. The property contains a single-family residence and garage. *Staff: Michael Draper*

- A. GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENT 22-01 AND MONO BASIN HIP CAMP SPECIFIC PLAN/Swiggum (~1:35 pm). Review General Plan Amendment 22-01 and implementation measures under the Mono Basin Hip Camp Specific Plan. General Plan Amendment 22-01 proposes to change the land use designation from Rural Residential (RR) to Specific Plan (SP) at 228 Cottonwood Canyon Road off State Route (SR) 167 in the Mono Basin (APN 013-210-026). The Mono Basin Hip Camp Specific Plan sets forth development standards for three camping areas with a combination of platforms for tents, fire rings, and RVs, and two cabins/bunkhouses. Each site will have vault toilets and other support infrastructure. A residential unit with accessory structures and utility infrastructure is also included. Staff: Bentley Regehr
- **B. LOT LINE ADJUSTMENT/ Baggett** (~1:40 pm) Final review for a lot line adjustment between APNs 019-080-001 & 019-080-004. The properties are located at 309 Summit Drive and

unassigned address in Virginia Lakes. The parcels are under different ownership and are both designated Single Family Residential (SFR). Parcel 019-080-001 is owned by the Virginia Lakes Mutual Water Company and parcel 019-080-004 is owned by the Baggett Family Trust. The parcels are part of the Twin Lakes subdivision. *Staff: April Sall*
