## **Emergency Preparedness**



### What is Emergency Preparedness?

Emergency preparedness refers to the steps you take to make sure you are safe before, during and after an emergency or natural disaster. These plans are important for your safety in both natural disasters and man-made disasters.

Mono County Public Health encourages residents and visitors to be prepared in the event of an emergency, especially as we enter the height of wildfire season. The following resources will help you prepare, respond, and recover from local emergencies.

#### **READY Mono**

READY Mono is Mono County's emergency preparedness campaign and web portal, designed to provide visitors residents and with emergency readiness, response, and recovery. READY Mono provides realtime information and critical updates during, before. and after an emergency or natural disaster. Examples of these events include (Coronavirus). COVID-19 Public Safety Power Shutoffs, and wildfire. The READY Mono portal can be and under accessed **here**. the "READY Mono" icon on the Mono County homepage.

#### **Zonehaven**

Mono County has invested in the Evacuation Zonehaven System (Zonehaven). Zonehaven is an interactive app-based software system that provides real-time updates on local emergencies to communicate with targeted communities as it relates to evacuation orders. "Know Your Zone" is a community awareness campaign to introduce residents and visitors to their evacuation zones. Mono County and the Town of Mammoth Lakes will be rolling out the "Know Your Zone" campaign in the coming weeks. #### The Citizen's Wildfire Education Academy

The Citizen's Wildfire Education Academy (Academy) is a seven-part series of free virtual sessions organized by the Eastern Sierra Council of Governments (ESCOG) educating the public on wildfires, and how to prepare for them. The Academy is aimed at reducing the anxiety about wildfire, and addressing and responding to the multitude of questions that residents and visitors have about the topic.

"Wildfires are becoming more devastating each year, threatening our communities, and decimating our forests and watersheds," said Bob Gardner, ESCOG Member and Chair of the Mono County Board of Supervisors. "We encourage you to join us for this important series as we address how to prepare for the upcoming wildfire season, and how to respond to the destructive impacts."
